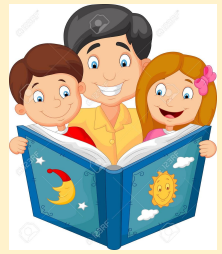

# Reading Books



Children will be read with by an adult regularly at school. We will change their books when they have finished reading their book.

We encourage the children to read at home 5 times a week. This can be to anyone! Mum, Dad, Sister, Brother, Auntie, Uncle, Grandparent- anyone who enjoys a good story! Please sign your child's reading record after reading with them at home. It only needs to be 5-10 minutes if you're short for time- every little helps when reading.

We do check these regularly with classes having rewards for reading at home.

# P.E.

The children are also expected to read at least 5 times a week but preferably daily and have their reading record signed by an adult. Reading records will be checked weekly.
