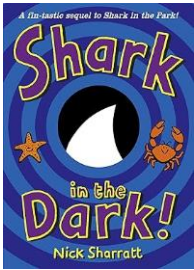


Week ahead

Light and Dark

Home Learning Challenges

Find a torch and shine it against a wall. What shadow shapes can you make using your hands and fingers? Can you put toys in front of the torch to see their shadow shapes?



Go outside on a sunny day. Can you see your shadow? Move your body around to make different shapes. Can you make your shadow long and tall? Can you make your shadow look round?



Ask an adult to take you outside when it is dark. What can you see? What can you hear? Do you know what any of the sounds belong to? Can you recognise any animal sounds?



Draw a night-themed picture on a white piece of paper using brightly coloured wax crayons. Then, mix some watery black paint and paint it over the whole picture. The shapes you drew using the wax crayons should shine out of the darkness.
